

What's the Diagnosis?



This gynaecological condition is characterised by abdominal pain that occurs during the menstrual cycle. Caused by endometrial tissue appearing outside the uterine cavity lining; generally confined to the pelvic area but can appear anywhere in the body, most commonly in the posterior and anterior cul-de-sac, uterosacral ligaments, and tubes and ovaries

Physical Findings

- Multiple tender nodules on uterosacral ligaments or the rectovaginal septum
- Enlarged nodules (tender during menses)
- Ovarian enlargement with cysts on the ovaries
- Thickened, nodular adnexa
- Tenderness of the adnexa, uterus, or posterior vaginal wall
- Pelvic exam may show pelvic masses, vaginal nodules, or fixed pelvic organs.

Mixed Reality in Nursing Practice



Among the most promising developments in digital healthcare technology is the rapidly evolving implementation of mixed reality (MR). MR blends the physical and digital worlds, creating environments where physical and digital objects co-exist and interact in real time. This integration is achieved by overlaying computer-generated images, animations, or data onto a user's view of the natural world, often using headsets or smart glasses. Augmented Reality (AR), a subset of MR, overlays digital information - such as images, sounds, or other data - onto the real world, enhancing the user's perception of their environment. In contrast, virtual reality (VR) creates a fully immersive experience separate from the real world.

MR is becoming increasingly common in healthcare. It transforms healthcare by enhancing training, procedural precision and remote collaboration, allowing for immersive simulation-based learning, real-time guidance and enhanced patient engagement.

Patient Participation in Acute Surgical Wound Care



Post-operative wound complications, such as surgical site infections and surgical wound dehiscence, are a global concern for healthcare systems. With 11% of general surgical patients developing an infection within 30 days of surgery, surgical site infections in particular are among the most prevalent healthcare-acquired infections, resulting in lengthier hospital stays and increased medical expenses. These complications also have a significant impact on Australia's healthcare infrastructure and budget, costing the Australian healthcare system an estimated \$323.5 million per year.

While there is limited research on patient participation specifically in surgical wound care, evidence from other areas, such as chronic wound care and diabetic ulcer treatment, shows that patient participation can improve treatment outcomes, reduce complications and enhance overall quality of life.
